

Chronic Kidney Disease in Children Cohort Study (CKiD)

QUESTION BY QUESTION SPECIFICATIONS

CENSUS BLOCK GROUP (CBG)

(COMPLETE a form for each DIFFERENT address where the child has resided)

The goal of this form is to document census block group data for each participant's address. Review the Census Block Group Information PowerPoint slides for instructions on obtaining the data from the US Census Bureau Fact Finder website.

- A1. Record the participant's I.D. number or affix label in the space provided.
- A2. The form version is pre-printed. Use the form version dated **11/01/10b**.
- A3. Record the initials of the person completing the form.
- A4. Record the date the form is completed – the month, day, and year.
- A5. The interviewer (study coordinator) should record the CKiD visit number (e.g., 01, 02, 03 or 04) that corresponds to the address. If there is any confusion or if the interviewer needs further instruction, contact your respective Clinical Coordinating Center (CCC). Also for children that have disenrolled, contact your CCC for instructions.
- A6. Indicate if the site is a Canadian Site by circling "Yes" (Code 1) or "No" (Code 2). If you record "Yes" (Code 1), **END FORM**.

SECTION B: CENSUS INFORMATION

For P.O. Box and highway addresses, Factfinder is unable to provide census tract and block group information. If the county is unknown, the coordinator must identify the county where the city is located. For example, "Catonsville" is located in Baltimore County. In order to find out the name of the county, go to: <http://factfinder2.census.gov> and enter the zip code or city. If the address is not a P.O. Box or highway, proceed as instructed in the PowerPoint slides.

In 2013, the website was revised. Carefully review the PowerPoint slides for detailed instructions on obtaining data from the US Census Bureau website.

- B1a. Record the state where the child resided at the time of the study visit.
For example, MO for Missouri.
- B1b. Record the state code. Use the coding sheet to identify the appropriate state code.
For example, Missouri's state code is 29.
- B2a. Record the county where the child resided at the time of the study visit. After entering the participant's address into the FactFinder, the name of the county will be provided.

For example, the Midwest CCC is located in “Jackson” County.

- B2b. Record the county code. Use the coding sheet to identify the appropriate county code.

For example, Jackson’s county code is 95. Therefore, 0 9 5 would be recorded on the form.

- B3. Record whether the address is a P.O. Box or Highway. If yes, then **End Form**. Otherwise, **go to B4**.

- B4. Record the census tract number. After entering the participant’s address into the FactFinder, the census tract number will be provided.

For example, the census tract number for the Midwest CCC is 31.

Therefore, 0 0 3 1 ■ 0 0 would be recorded.

- B5. Record the block group. After entering the participant’s address into the FactFinder, the name of the block group will be provided.

For example, the block group number for the Midwest CCC is 1.

Therefore, 0 1 would be recorded.
