

**F22MED – Visit 20 Changes**  
**Version 4/1/04**

1. Added new PI to medication list in question B2a. 249 Lexiva (fosamprenavir).
2. Add to introduction for questions B9a – B9c, “We realize that some people might find these questions offensive, or that you may be tired of answering them since they’re asked at every visit. We apologize for the repetition, but need to ask these questions at every visit to be able to tell if people’s attitudes toward HIV transmission change when they change medications.
3. Add question E10b to F22MEDs6, “Have you taken this in the past 5 days?”
4. Add instruction E10c to F22MEDs6, “Interviewer, record here how use of this medication was reported.”
5. Change skip pattern for question F1a. If “no,” now skip to question F5.
6. Question F1b and Drug List 3: Delete alternative/complementary medication codes 503 (other nutritional supplements, unspecified) and 539 (other herbs, unspecified). Therapies that would have formerly fell into either of these codes should now be recorded in the specify boxes with the appropriate code from Drug List 3, or if there is none, with code 699 (other alternative/complementary medication). The QxQs have been updated to provide instruction on how to complete this question.
7. Change skip pattern for question F2. If “primary care provider,” now skip to question F5.
8. Change skip pattern for question F3. If “yes” or “don’t have a primary care provider,” now skip to question F5.
9. Add question F5, “In the last six months, have you eaten powdered cornstarch for your health?” If “no,” skip to section G.
10. Add question F5a, “On average how often do you eat cornstarch?”
11. Add question F5b, “When you eat cornstarch, how much do you consume?”
