



30 Year Celebration







Thank you for joining us in celebrating the 30 years of WIHS & 40 years of MACS. We were thrilled to see those of you who could make it! Your presence played a crucial role in making this event a success.



After more than 30 years serving as Principal Investigator for the WIHS (now MAC-WIHS CCS) study, Dr. Kathryn Anastos has chosen to retire. She made a formal announcement at our WIHS 30 year celebration.

Dr. Anastos had worked with community activists in the early 1990s to advocate for a study for women with HIV. In 1993, when the NIH agreed to fund this study, she submitted a successful application to start the Bronx/Manhattan WIHS. In addition to her care of patients living with HIV and her leadership of WIHS now the MACS/WIHS Combined Cohort, she has has also worked to develop HIV/AIDS research and scientific capacity in Africa, including the countries of Rwanda, Democratic Republic of Congo, Burundi, Cameroon and Republic of Congo.

All of us here will miss Dr. Anastos. She has taught us so much about what it takes to follow a passion and advocate for others.
