After you are done, please hand in the questionnaire. You will be given a sheet with the answers, which we hope will help you to understand the issues around Pap testing. Feel free to ask about anything that still concerns you.

Keep in mind that filling out this questionnaire is voluntary. If you decide not to take part in this, just let us know. No one will treat you differently if you decide not to go ahead with this. I can read this form to you or if you prefer, you may complete it by yourself.
